Fraser Coast Integrated Transport Strategy

Project consultation overview — March 2025

Transport infrastructure planning in the Fraser Coast Local Government Area (LGA) is shared between the Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR) and the Fraser Coast Regional Council (FCRC).

In response to growing demands on the Fraser Coast's urban transport network, FCRC and TMR have partnered to identify and address issues and needs of the Fraser Coast's existing transport network.

Community feedback will help to develop a key transport and land use planning resource, the Fraser Coast Integrated Transport Strategy (the strategy). A community consultation process will inform a whole-of-system, integrated transport and land use strategy and investigate opportunities to improve accessibility and mobility in and around the Fraser Coast local government area (LGA) to forecast, plan and prioritise transport initiatives over the next 25 years.

The strategy is a \$1.028 million planning project jointly funded with the Queensland Government and the Fraser Coast Regional Council contributing 50:50.

The strategy's scope includes investigation of how the Fraser Coast's future transport network will embrace innovative technology to become more accessible and responsive to a wide range of users to respond to their transport habits, needs and issues, while continuing to support improved economic opportunities in the local government area.

The accelerated growth commercially and residentially on the Fraser Coast, particularly in Hervey Bay, outlines the need to improve access to these high growth hubs to facilitate the movement of people and freight, enabling the continued growth of the region's economic profile.

It considers all transport modes including general traffic, freight, active and passenger transport, air, rail and marine and will contribute to improving capacity and accessibility of the Fraser Coast transport network out to 2050.

The strategy will contribute to improved lifestyle and liveability in the Fraser Coast LGA by staged development of the transport network over the short (5 - 10 years), medium (10-15 years) and long-term (20+ years) to 2050.
