Current Cemetery Services

Council manages a number of cemeteries across the Fraser Coast, including:

- Polson Cemetery (Hervey Bay)
- Maryborough Cemetery
- Nikenbah Natural Cemetery (natural burials)
- Howard Cemetery
- Tiaro Cemetery
- Munna Creek Cemetery

Please note - Council also manages Deborah Cemetery (Netherby) and Nikenbah Cemetery - these cemeteries are limited to special circumstances only - for burials.

On average, 220 burials take place across the region each year, with around 100 in Hervey Bay and 120 in Maryborough.

Polson Cemetery (Corser Street, Point Vernon, Hervey Bay)

Hervey Bay's main cemetery features include:

- Lawn and Monumental Sections
- Columbarium Walls
- Wall of Remembrance
- Garden Niches
- South Sea Islander Memorial and Cemetery, commemorating the region's South Sea Islander heritage.

Maryborough Cemetery (Walker Street, Maryborough)

The Maryborough Cemetery is heritage-listed and features two key sections:

- Monumental Section: Established in 1873 & home to the historic Mortuary Chapel (1883), this area includes traditional graves & headstones.
- Garden of Rest: Opened in 1960, located opposite the Monumental Section. It includes columbarium walls, war graves, garden niches, & a dedicated Children's Memorial Garden.

Nikenbah Natural Cemetery (Chapel Road, Nikenbah)

Queensland's first natural burial site on Council land, this cemetery opened in 2023 and offers:

- Eco-conscious burials without embalming, headstones, or concrete vaults.
- Landscaping is limited to the removal of overgrowth, with the intent that the cemetery looks and feels, as much as possible, like a natural landscape.

Howard Cemetery (Cemetery Road, Howard)

Established in 1882, Howard Cemetery sits in a peaceful bushland setting. It provides:

• Monumental Burial Sites, serving the local community in a traditional, rural environment.

Tiaro Cemetery (Bruce Highway, Tiaro)

Located on the Maryborough side of the Tiaro township. This rural cemetery provides:

- Monumental Burial Options and
- Columbarium Walls for ashes.

Munna Creek Cemetery (Bauple-Woolooga Road, Munna Creek)

Over 100 years old, this cemetery is nestled in a quiet bushland area:

• Monumental Burial Sites that reflect the area's rich history and connection to the land.
